Before You Start

In this lesson you'll be learning how to play 2 fretted notes one after the other. Make sure that before you start you have completed lesson 1 and can play 1 note cleanly and in time,

When You've Finished

At the end of this lesson you'll have learned to fret 2 notes one after the other. You'll also have start refining your left hand position.

- 1. You'll have learned how to efficiently play more than one note on your fretboard.
- 2. You'll be working towards finding an efficient hand position

Exercise # 1

Start by repeating the fretting exercise from lesson 1, playing one note cleanly, the Bb on the 3rd fret of the bass string, and then the G on the open string.

- 1. With your first finger on that 3rd fret move your third finger to the 5th fret on that same string as I do in the video and play the C note. Don't move your first finger.
- 2. Your wrist should still be straight, there should be minimum movement in your hand and none in your arm.
- 3. With the same efficiency of movement lift just your third finger from the string, the first finger should have remained unmoved ready to play the Bb note.
- 4. Use as little pressure as is needed in order to hear each note cleanly.
- 5. Co-ordinate your right and left hands by playing in time at a slow tempo.

Exercise # 2

This one is the same as the previous except that now you're also playing the open string.

- 1. Again keep your first finger on the fret as the third finger comes down, only take it off to play the open string.
- 2. Again pick up and down and in time.
- 3. Once you can play at a slow tempo stop and play a little bit faster.
